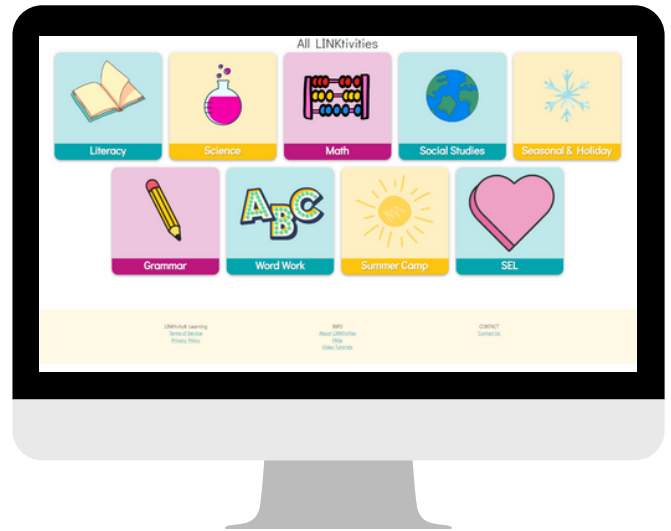

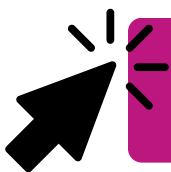

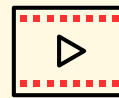

**Materials Needed**

**Teacher Preparation**  
Preview the Idiom LINKtivity® and plan for how you will share the LINKtivity with students (ex. assign link in Google Classroom, prepare QR codes, etc.)  
Make copies of the recording sheet (optional).  
Make copies of the idiom cards. You'll want to make enough copies so each student can have one card. It's OK if more than one student has the same idiom card. Cut and laminate. Print off the Idiom poster. Laminate, if possible, for durability.

**Lesson Introduction (5-10 min.)**

- Introduce the essential question, and if needed, review the concept of figurative language.
- Introduce each student with an **Idiom card**.
- Provide students to read their card, observed the underlined text, and reflect on whether they have ever heard this phrase before.
- Invite students to form groups of 3-4 students. In their groups, have them read their cards to each other and discuss potential meanings.
- Bring students back together. Use the **poster** to introduce idioms. Explore each idiom from the cards and facilitate a class discussion about their meanings.
- Watch the "Learn It" video as a class. You can find it in LINKtivity® or by [clicking here](#). Ensure that students have a clear understanding of an idiom.

**Lesson Activity (20 mins)**  
Have students complete the **Idioms LINKtivity®**. While navigating the LINKtivity®, students have the option to complete the **recording sheet**.

**Optional Extension Activities**

- Have students keep a running list of idiom phrases that they come across in their reading. Option: Create a class list.
- Have students create an illustration to represent an idiom. Option: Create a class book of these illustrations.

**Lesson Conclusion (2-5 min.)**  
Review essential questions and have students share their responses in light of what they have learned.

### Idioms

An **idiom** is a phrase that means something different

### Alliteration

**Alliteration** is when the beginning sound of a word is repeated more times in a word or sentence

A **metaphor** is used to compare two things that are different in most ways but are the same in one, important way

### Similes

A **simile** is a type of figurative language that compares two different things using the word 'like' or 'as.'



Kaya ran **as fast as** a cheetah!

Kaya ran fast **like** a cheetah!

### Personification

**Personification** is a type of figurative language that gives human qualities, actions, or emotions to non-human objects

### Hyperboles

A **hyperbole** is when a statement is exaggerated to make a point.



### Onomatopoeia

An **onomatopoeia** is a word that sounds like its meaning.



That sounds like what you hear.
