


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Anne Frank was a Jewish girl who gained international fame after her diary, which she wrote while in hiding during World War II, was published posthumously. During their time in hiding, Anne wrote in her diary about her life in the secret annex, her thoughts and feelings, and her dreams for the future. As a young Jewish girl during WWII, Anne wrote in her diary about her experiences as a Jewish victim during the Holocaust. The diary had been a gift to Anne for her 13th birthday. She wrote in the diary from June 12, 1942 until August 1, 1944. The diary offers a glimpse into the daily life of a girl in hiding during Nazi German occupation of the Netherlands.

CONTRIBUTIONS & ACHIEVEMENTS

Anne Frank is widely remembered for her amazing ability to express herself through writing. After the Holocaust, her father found and published her diary. This firsthand account of the events surrounding the Holocaust became known as The Diary of a Young Girl. It has been translated into many languages and has been read all over the world teaching people about kindness and compassion.



BORN


Anne Frank was born to a Jewish family in Frankfurt, Germany on June 12, 1929. Shortly after she was born, Germany was taken over by the Nazis, a group of people led by Adolf Hitler, who severely mistreated the Jewish people.

World War II


In 1939, World War II broke out. During the war, a horrible time known as the Holocaust began. Adolf Hitler and the Nazi Party tried to destroy and eliminate the Jewish people. Anne Frank and her family hid in a small room, known as the Annex, for about two years to escape the cruelty of the Nazis.

The Diary of Anne Frank

While in hiding, Anne Frank kept a diary of her daily life. She wrote about how the Jewish people felt during the events surrounding the Holocaust. Unfortunately, Anne Frank and her family were eventually discovered and captured by the Nazis. After the war, her diary was found and turned into a book, giving the world a look into what life was like in hiding.

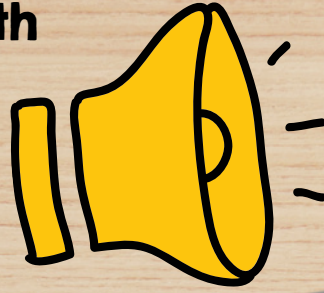

Lesson Plan

LESSON

ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS:

What is a biography?
Who is (specific person) and what makes him/her unique?



Note: This lesson plan can be used with any mini-biography LINKtivity.

Standards Covered

CCRA.R.10

Materials Needed

Biography LINKtivity®
KWL student sheet
Biography student sheet (optional)
Chart paper/markers OR SMARTboard/Whiteboard

Teacher Preparation

Preview the mini-biography(ies) that you have selected for your students. Plan for how you will share the LINKtivity with students (ex. assign link in Google Classroom, prepare QR codes, etc). Prepare a KWL chart on chart paper or SMARTboard/whiteboard. Print the KWL and biography student sheets.

Lesson Introduction (5-10 min.)

- Introduce the essential questions.
- Introduce the person(s) your students will be exploring and provide each student with a **KWL student sheet**.
- **ASK:** What do you know about this person? What do you want to know about this person?
- Have students complete the first two columns of the chart. Note: If your whole class is exploring the same person, you can complete this chart together on a SMARTboard/whiteboard. If each student is completing a different person, have them complete a KWL for their specific person.

Lesson Activity (20 mins)

Have students complete a **Biography LINKtivity**, either one assigned to them or of their own selection. While navigating the LINKtivity, students have the option to complete the **biography student sheet**.

Optional Extension Activities

- Take virtual field trips to museums, historical sites, or places related to the person's life using a tool like Google Earth.
- Have students record a podcast episode about their person.
- Host a wax museum event where students dress up and take on the persona of their chosen individual to educate others.

Lesson Conclusion (2-5 min.)

Review essential questions and have students share their responses in light of what they have learned. Have students complete the final column of their KWL chart (what I learned).
