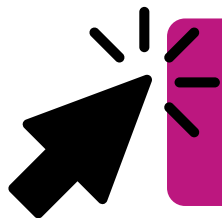

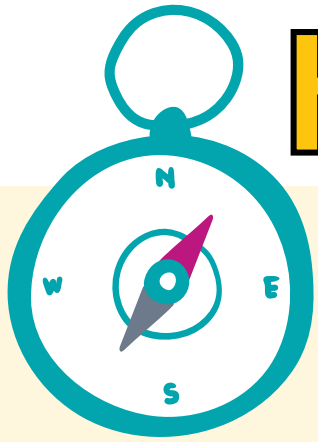

Not all sharks look like...well...sharks! Look at these **weird-looking sharks!** The goblin, frilled, cookiecutter, and megamouth sharks are all unique looking sharks found in ocean waters around the world!

**SNAP A PICTURE**

The Dwarf Lantern Shark is the smallest shark in the ocean! Unlike other massive-sized sharks, this shark is only about 6-7 inches (15-17 cm) long. It lives off the coast of Colombia and Venezuela in the Caribbean Sea.

**SNAP A PICTURE**

Wobbegong sharks are often hidden among the rocks, waiting to prey on other fish. They live in the Pacific ocean. Their name comes from an Australian word that means "shaggy beard."

**SNAP A PICTURE**

Zebra sharks are commonly found on coral reefs in the Indian and Pacific Oceans. Their unique color and patterns change as they grow. Adult zebra sharks can reach over 11 feet.

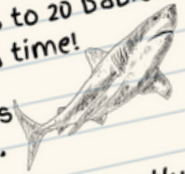
