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

Materials Needed Standards Covered Biography LINKtivity® KWL student sheet CCRA.R.10 Biography student sheet (optional) Chart paper/markers OR SMARTboard/Whiteboard **Teacher Preparation** Preview the mini-biography(ies) that you have selected for your students. Plan for how you will share the LINKtivity with students (ex. assign link in Google Classroom, prepare QR codes, etc). Prepare a KWL chart on chart paper or SMARTboard/whiteboard.
